THE NEW EYFS FRAMEWORK

Main Changes

Statutory from September 2021

- Focus on language and vocabulary development.
- Greater focus on physical development – fine and gross motor skills.
- Based on latest evidence in childhood development.
- No exceeding judgement.
- Children assessed expected or emerging in each ELG at the end of the year.
- No requirement to record evidence – practitioners knowledge of the child.

Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage

Setting the standards for learning, development and care for children from birth to five

Published: 31 March 2021 Effective: 1 September 2021

DEVELOPMENT MATTERS 2021

Main Changes

- Not to be used as a tick list.
- Focus on spending time with the children, teaching a broad and balanced curriculum.
- Broader age bands:
 - Birth to three
 - Threes and fours
 - The Reception year
- Children to be assessed as on track or not on track
- Children not on track may need additional support and assessment



- The children should be able to wear similar clothes to their PE clothing.











'Children who read for pleasure are likely to do significantly better at school than their peers, making greater progress in mathematics, development of vocabulary and spelling.'



DONT STOP!

- Some 44% of 1,000 parents of 6- to 11-year-olds polled said they rarely or never read with their child after their seventh birthday.
- Parents should continue reading with their children throughout primary school.

ACT NOW BEFORE IT'S TOO LATE!

- Reading 6 times a
 week is an extra
 hours support for you
 child.
- Children who read outside school were
 - 13 times more likely to read above the expected level for their age.

READING AT HOME

- Listen to your child read every night it only takes 10 minutes!
- Take turns to read aloud to each other. They
 can learn from your expressive reading and you
 can check they are not struggling
- Ask questions about the book about what might happen next or a character's motivation
- Make sure they understand any new or unusual words or phrases

TAPESTRY




- Each child will have their own Tapestry account.

HOMEWORK

Phonics

- During RWInc sessions the children will learn up to 5 new sounds a week.
- Children need to be able to quickly recall the sound that each letter makes.
- Children can start practising segmenting and blending.
