OBJECTIVES IDENTIFIED FOR 2022 - 2023

- 1. To address the interruption to the pupils' physical development as a result of COVID 19 and provide children with physical activities through a wide range of in school and out of hours sports choices.
- 2. Provide professional development opportunities for leaders and teachers in PE and Sport through the use of team teaching INSET, bought in training from, Real PE and Complete PE and continue to use and introduce online training opportunities.
- 3. Ensure the continuation of high quality Swimming for all as a weekly taught lesson throughout the year and the provision of additional swims in support of individual special or health needs.
- 4. Continue to enable children to successfully engage in a range of sporting activities through the provision of replacement kit, for PE and swimming as well as obtaining resources from timetabled inter school sporting events.
- 5. Continue to fund training for and access to inter-school competitions and sporting events and ensure the most able are identified and provided for.
- 6. Purchasing individual use resources to restock and replenish due to loss or wear and tear.



Key Acheivements to date until July 2023

This year we had several achievements in sport and Team Hamstel performed well in local competitions.

- We won Southend 3 tees Cricket and came 2nd in the Essex county finals.
- We were 2nd at Tag Rugby
- We placed 2nd in the KS1 Borough Sports
- Two of our girls placed 2nd and 3rd respectively at Quad kids and our team finished 2nd overall.
- At football we came 3rd in the boy's tournament
- Our girl's football team competed in a tournament for the first time
- In cross country we came 3rd overall
- · We had a team represent the school in gymnastics for the first time
- Our SEND children took part in Panathlon
- We took 30 children to the mini games event and had children taking part in a speed stacking event.
- All KS1 children have received a weekly swimming lesson
- Sporting and physical achievements were celebrated in our weekly celebration assembly
- Year groups Sports Days were organised, allowing all children to participate and parents to attend

- Improve the adaptations used for SEND pupils and More Able children
- Create more active opportunities throughout the day to ensure every child has the opportunity to be active for at least 60 minutes a day
- Develop our physical spaces to maximise our PE opportunities
- Continue our commitment to early swimming
- Continue our commitment to girl's football
