Provide high quality teaching and subject leadership in PE and Sport.3. Develop our school grounds and building to allow for a greater variety of sport, physical exercise and games.4. Make a commitment to developing girl’s football opportunities5. Ensure the continuation of high-quality swimming for all as a weekly taught lesson throughout the year and the provision of additional swims in support of individual special or health needs.6. Broaden the opportunities and experiences offered during our children’s playtimes to provide greater scope for enjoyment and challenge of physical activity.
