Summary of Primary Sport Premium

Our Objectives for 2024 – 2025

1. To continue to develop children’s physical development and experience of sport by offering a wide range of physical activities and opportunities both in school and out.
2. Provide high quality teaching and subject leadership in PE and Sport, with a particular emphasis on dance and gymnastics this year.
3. Broaden the opportunities and experiences offered during our children’s playtimes to provide greater scope for enjoyment and challenge of physical activity and look to develop our playground to better support exercise and games.
4. Despite the challenges of our own school pool closing, ensure the continuation of high-quality swimming for KS1 children throughout the year and the provision of additional swims in support of individual special or health needs.
5. Provide children with different sporting visitors to widen their experiences and aspirations.

Key Achievements to date until July 2025

This year we had several achievements in sport and Team Hamstel performed well in local competitions.

- Our sports teams took part in tag rugby, dodgeball, 3Ts cricket and the mini games competitions
- We participated in the first Portico Academy sports event involving all five schools
- We won the Quad Kids event for the second successive year

Areas for further improvement

- Set up further sports clubs for School sports teams especially girls
- Ensure all staff are confident in understanding and teaching the P.E curriculum
- high focus on dance and gymnastics CPD
- Ensure consistency of teaching across KS1 and EYFS

- We came third in the inter-school cross country event
- We came overall third place in the Borough Sports
- Our team of dancers participated in the Infant Dance festival
- Our SEND children took part in Panathlon and won gold.
- All KS1 children took part in a week's swimming introduction
- Sporting and physical achievements were celebrated in our weekly celebration assembly with every participant getting a certificate and winners receiving medals
- Year groups Sports Days were organised, allowing all children to participate and parents to attend

- Improve the adaptations used for SEND pupils and More Able children
- Continue to develop our active playtimes to ensure equipment is modelled, used correctly and encouraged.
- Develop our physical spaces to maximise our PE opportunities
- Continue our commitment to early swimming
- Continue our commitment to give sporting opportunities to all
